Station agrees to provide care and custody for Owner's horse. Owner agrees to pay the Station in advance for such services. Account is payable by the 10th, and if payment is not received by the 20th, a service charge will be assessed. First month's board will be prorated, but all subsequent board will be by the month. Thirty (30) days notice must be given when leaving or the Owner will be responsible for an additional month's board. Accounts not paid in full within ninety days triggers forfeiture of the horse under Stablemen's Lien Procedures.

Owner specifically represents that the Owner is the sole owner or bonafide lessee of the horse described herein and that there is no lien or mortgage against the named horse. Owner certifies that all the information stated above regarding named horse is true and correct.

Boarder's Assumption of Risks and Agreement to Hold Stable Harmless. Boarder understands that keeping Horses at any boarding stable, including Station, is inherently risky. For example, in common areas, such as arenas, tie racks and wash racks, other horses could bite, kick, run into or otherwise injure Horses. Horses may be allergic to feed or bedding material and they may catch diseases or other contagious conditions from other horses. Farm activity, traffic or other hazards may spook Horses. Horses in stalls or paddocks may become cast, be bitten or kicked by neighboring horses or otherwise become injured. In wet or cold weather, Stable grounds, including paddocks, round pens and arenas may become muddy or slippery, injuring Horse. Stable premises may contain defects. For example, footing on Stable's premises, including round pens, paddocks and arena footing can contain holes, rocks, uneven portions or otherwise be Unpredictable. As in any boarding stable, there is always a risk of fire or theft. Boarder understands and expressly assumes all risk of keeping Horses on the Station premises, including the risk that Station, Station's owners, officers, directors, shareholders, employees, contractors or agents (collectively, the "Stable Parties) may be negligent. Accordingly, Boarder agrees to holdthe Stable Parties harmless for loss of or injury to Horses. Owner Initial

Other Conditions.

- -Inoculations and worming must be done on a regular basis and recorded with the Station.
- -Each person riding or allowing someone else to ride Horse on Station property or on the surrounding farmland must sign a liability waiver.
- -If removing your horse from the Station for more than three days, or in the case of Owner's vacation, notification must be made to the Station of an emergency number and emergency procedures allowed.
- -No outside dogs are allowed on the Station.
- In the event that Horse causes damages to Station property beyond normal wear and tear (including but not limited to kicking, biting, or otherwise damaging Station structures, plumbing, trees, equipment, or other property), Owner will be responsible for the cost of repairs.
- -In the event of any litigation arising out of this agreement, the prevailing parties shall be entitled to a reasonable sum as and for his/her attorney's fees. Such litigation will take place in Yolo County, California.
